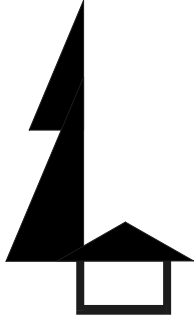

Subject: *A SECOND CALL TO ACTION*

Dear Cabin Owner;

Many of you responded to our first *Call to Action* in March of 2008 with letters to your Senators or Congressmen expressing your deep concern about the way the Forest Service has chosen to implement CUFFA and requesting their assistance in remedying this situation. Your previous letters were instrumental in bringing the fee issue to the attention of Congress. Cabin Coalition 2 and NFH thank you for that.

We have come to a critical new time where your involvement is needed again. Our friends in Congress are considering how to help us and they need to know just how devastating the new fees are and what we want them to do. For this reason, we need to ask you to write again to your Senators and Congressman with a direct message and a request for their assistance.

Please email, fax, or write a new letter, that expresses the following issues:

- The fees based on the new appraisals WILL force numerous cabin owners to sell or remove their cabins, and cabin owners are outraged. Include your own appraisal/fee numbers if you have them now;
- There must be legislative hearings focusing on the CUFFA/fair fee issue no later than this summer; and
- Please, Senator or Congressman, work with others on your committees, or in Congress to advance these two issues, as time is truly critical for many cabin owners.

Send your letter NOW, or surely no later than Memorial Day. As before, so that we have some idea of the letters that are sent, please email a copy to <mailto:mike8558@psln.com>. This allows us to confirm your email address, so we can stay organized for our best efforts.
